"For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." Matthew 18:20. This familiar verse is the origin of the name of our coffee bar "Cafe 18:20". For nearly four years this space in the lobby of the church has been the gathering place of spiritual friends.

Cafe 18:20 offers barista styled hot drinks and fruit smoothies. Sunday, Tuesday and Wednesday mornings homemade sweets add to the gathering experience. Donations are accepted when you order your favorite cuppa. The proceeds are given to missions, both local and international.

Mission is the heart of the cafe vision as the official coffee of the Cafe 18:20 is Lanna grown in Northern Thailand. This brand of coffee was introduced as an alternative income source in an area previously known for growing poppies for drugs. American Baptist missionaries, Dick and Marlene Mann, began this project. Their son, Mike Mann, directs projects to bring clean water to villages in Thailand. Part of the proceeds of our cafe aids this water project.

To date 1426 cups have been served. While we sip our drinks and gather with church friends, we supplement the income of people in Thailand as well as assist the healthy delivery of life giving water to villages. Don't miss the opportunity to gather with friends and save some lives!

CONNECTIONS PRESCHOOL

Over 54 preschoolers will begin the fall session of Connections Preschool, ministry of First Baptist Church. The morning is the academic portion of our curriculum. The preschool offers an extended program with lunch and afternoon activities. Each month of the school year, the preschool emphasizes the fruit of the Spirit. September will focus on self-control and explore how we act toward one another even when we may not always get our way.
